





2021 Keynote: Dr. Jason Hickel of "Less is More: How Degrowth will Save the World"

Tuesday, November 16

Dr. Jason Hickel is an economic anthropologist, author of "Less is More: How Degrowth will Save the World," and a Professor at the Institute for Environmental Science and Technology at the Autonomous University of Barcelona. Jason's research focuses on global inequality, political economy, post-development, and ecological economics. In addition to his academic work, Jason writes regularly for *The Guardian* and *Foreign Policy* and contributes to a number of other online outlets, including Al Jazeera and *Fast Company.*

His Keynote will address the impacts of inequality and resource extraction, new forms of value creation, and how we can decouple growth from business status quo.


