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A. About the document

TE-TXL-POL-204 Standard-Specific Details for Assurance Systems (TE-TXL-POL-204) includes details specific to each Textile Exchange standard that are relevant for the issuance of scope and transaction certificates.

This document is intended to be used alongside *TE-TXL-POL-203 Policy for Scope and Transaction Certificates* (TE-TXL-POL-203), as applicable, and does not represent all criteria related to scope and transaction certificates.

A1. Implementation

The following implementation timelines apply:

A1.1.1 *TE-TXL-POL-204-V1.0 Standard-Specific Details for Assurance Systems* is effective **October 1, 2026**, and may be used as of that date.

A1.1.2 *TE-TXL-POL-204-V1.0 Standard-Specific Details for Assurance Systems* is mandatory on **April 1, 2027**. From this date onwards, all audits and assessments are required to be conducted using *TE-TXL-POL-204-V1.0 Standard-Specific Details for Assurance Systems*.

1.2.6 Non-mandatory criteria do not apply to the OCS.

1.2.7 The *Organic Content Standard* is a single accreditation scope. Accreditation subsopes do not apply to the OCS. Applicable materials (cotton, animal materials, other fiber crops, other) should be specified in the scope of accreditation.

- a. Farm capacity shall be reported per raw material code included on the scope certificate.
- b. Number of animals shall be reported using RM0330 for the raw material code, such that the total number of animals reported reflects the total number of animals raised per year.

NOTE:

- 1) RM0330 is used to report the number of animals for all RDS farm scope certificates, regardless of if this code is included on the scope certificate or not.

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- 2.1.3** Non-mandatory criteria do not apply to the CCS.
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- 2.1.4** The *Content Claim Standard* is a single accreditation scope. Accreditation subscopes do not apply to the CCS.
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Section 3: Details for scope and transaction certificates

3.1. Additional scopes

- 3.1.1** No additional scopes apply. Details of additional scopes will be added in an update to this document when available.

3.2. Scope certificate stipulation

This section details scope stipulations that are required to be included on scope certificates in the scope stipulations (`scCbScopeStipulations`) field.

- 3.2.1** The following statements may be used to meet *TE-TXL-POL-203-V4.0 Policy for Scope and Transaction Certificates, 2.4.3*. This criterion only applies to animal fiber and hide/raw hide farms and is optional for small-scale farmer groups.
- Suitable pain relief is used for all husbandry procedures for all animals within this scope certificate.
 - This scope certificate covers countries/areas where the availability of pain relief for husbandry procedures differs. Suitable pain relief is only being used for all husbandry procedures for all animals within this scope certificate located in [country/area or state/province] (and is being phased in for all animals in [country/area or state/province] where it is newly available).
 - Suitable pain relief is currently being phased in for all husbandry procedures for all animals, as it is newly available in [country/area or state/province].
 - Suitable pain relief is not currently available in [country/area or state/province], so animal welfare criteria for pain relief were not evaluated. This is based on legal and regulatory limitations rather than choices made by the certified organization or certified farms.
 - Painful husbandry procedures are not conducted on animals within this scope certificate.
 - The use of pain relief is an optional leadership criterion for small-scale farmer groups due to the costs involved. This leadership criterion was [met/not met/partially met/not evaluated] for this small-scale farmer group.

NOTE:

- The statement in f is only permitted for small-scale farmer groups in counties where suitable pain relief is available, and requires that the level of conformity be selected.

- 3.2.2** For the statements from 3.1.1, **species** shall be replaced with the species name [sheep/angora goats/alpacas]. The **country/area** and **state/province** shall be replaced with the applicable country/area or state/province information based on TE-TXL -DAT-502.

3.3. Transaction certificate product details

- 3.3.1** The following unit metrics may be used to describe the number of units of a product in TE-TXL-POL-203, 5.10.3.e. Metrics shall be submitted using only lowercase letters (a-z) with the exact spellings listed in the table.

- 3.3.2** A margin of error in material composition for TE-TXL-POL-203, 4.6.2 applies as follows:
- a. Criterion for blended materials containing mechanically recycled textile fibers will be added in a future revision to this policy (see note 1);
 - b. Criterion for non-blended materials containing mechanically recycled textile fibers will be added in a future revision to this policy (see note 1);
 - c. $\pm 10\%$ for reclaimed materials sold by a certified collector or concentrator;
 - d. $\pm 3\%$ for all other blended materials; and
 - e. -2% for all other non-blended materials.

EXAMPLES:

The following are examples of how the margin of error shall be applied:

- 1) A fabric is composed of 98% organic cotton (RM0104) with 2% elastane (RM0160). The elastane shall be reflected in the material composition since it is added intentionally.
- 2) A yarn which is calculated to be 100% post-consumer cotton (RM0107) is shown to contain 1.5% polyester (unintentionally) in composition testing. The yarn shall be claimed as 100% post-consumer cotton (RM0107) as the polyester was not added intentionally. Additional information from 4.6.3.a shall be included on the transaction certificate.
- 3) A fabric which is calculated to contain 90% responsible wool (RM0083) + 10% acrylic (RM0156) is shown through composition testing to contain 7% acrylic. The fabric shall have a material composition of 90% responsible wool (RM0104) + 10% acrylic (RM0156) listed on the transaction certificate.

NOTE:

- 1) The language used for 3.3.2.a and 3.3.2.b is currently tentative and will be updated in a future version of this document.

- 3.3.3** The following cases are not considered to exceed the margin of error:
- a. The presence of mixed fibers (i.e., RM0258, RM0260, and/or RM0261) in the product composition, where the exact content is unknown; and
 - b. The use of trims or visible, isolable fibers used for decorative, ornamental, or functional purposes that are included in the composition calculations but not considered in the composition tests.

- 3.3.4** A component or a product which does not have components may have multiple claims categories provided that the claims categories are for different standards and the following are met:
- a. The product shall not have a claims category for the Materials Matter Standard and one or more claims categories for the following standards: GRS, RCS, RWS, RMS, and RAS. This applies at the product level regardless if the product has components or not. And
 - b. A component or product without components shall not have claims categories for both the GRS and RCS.

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- 3.3.5** The following process shall apply to list inputs for VR2 materials (see CCS-105) on transaction certificates to meet TE-TXL-POL-203, 5.10.4 since the products cannot be linked to a specific incoming transaction certificate or Reclaimed Material Declaration Form (RMDF):
- a. The incoming transaction certificate number (`tcProductIncomingTcNo`) shall show the oldest incoming transaction certificate or RMDF number with the inputs used for the product and with available remaining balance. More than one transaction certificate or RMDF may be listed if necessary to include sufficient input weights.
 - b. The statement “VR2 materials cannot be tracked to a specific incoming transaction certificate.” shall be included in (`tcProductInfoAdditional`) when the inputs are from transaction certificates. When the inputs are from RMDFs, the words “transaction certificate” shall be replaced by “RMDF.”
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
